

Family Ministries/Faith Formation

When I started in this position five years ago, our church found itself with a dwindling Church School and a Youth Fellowship program that was seriously lacking in numbers. As we looked at who was left, we sat with the Education Commission and made some decisions about how to foster a sense of community for younger families at Wilbraham United Church.

We opted to start a number of events that we called Family Nights without a clear definition of "family," except to remind everyone that "families come in all shapes and sizes." Without yet being introduced to the phrase "Extravagant Welcome" we found ourselves doing just that by opening our doors and welcoming all. This happened at our Family Nights as well as VBC. Not only did they come, some of them saw what they liked and stayed!

Our Church School program has literally boomed as we have increased our enrollment from 18 in 2015 to **49 in 2019**!! We attribute this growth to our Extravagant Welcome to our VBC families as well as those neighbors who join us for our Family Night events.

I want to thank and congratulate the community of Wilbraham United Church. Please continue to put word and deed into action as we extend Extravagant Welcome to our neighbors.






Holly Fair News:
