## A note from Pastor Chip...

Dear Church,

Our congregation usually gets its weekly scriptures from the Revised Common Lectionary, which chooses a passage from the Hebrew Bible, another from one of the Epistles, and a Gospel lesson. The folks who worked on establishing and creating the RCL put much scholarly thought and prayerful discernment into determining which passages work well together, weaving together different modes of writing and strands of thought into a beautiful tapestry that allows congregations like ours to read through much of the Bible every three years. It is a remarkable achievement in its own right. And it is an invaluable resource for many pastors when it comes to worship planning.

For the last six weeks in worship, however, we have tried something different. We have still read the RCL gospel reading, but we have included excerpts from the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's "Letter from a Birmingham Jail" which he wrote in April of 1963, after being arrested for participating in demonstrations, boycotts, and sit-ins in protest of racism and racial segregation in Birmingham, Alabama, throughout the South, and in the United States. While Rev. Dr. King's "Letter" is not an epistle found in our Bibles, it is indeed a Christian Letter that speaks to themes common in the letters to the various Christian communities with which we are so familiar. Dr. King writes of the Christian call to justice and love, to solidarity with the suffering, to freedom for the oppressed and release to the captive. Dr. King writes about the need to live our faith in this world, and to extend the reach of God's beloved community to include all people.

I have appreciated the conversation and the feedback that I have gotten from many of you. I have treasured the responses that I have received from those who had never read the Letter before, and those who were familiar with it and found it relevant in our day and age. Indeed, the letters of Paul have stood the test of two millennia. His calls to love and justice, to peace and mercy, to faith and grace, ring loudly in our ears and deeply in our souls not only because they are familiar, but because they remain true and necessary to our lives as Christians.

While we have made tremendous progress in living out those calls, from Paul's time and from King's time, we still need to be reminded that we are not yet done, and of our responsibility to continue to build God's beloved community. As we move into the season of Lent and return to reading from the Revised Common Lectionary, let us not forget that there are still those in this world that are calling out to us with the prophetic voice, and let us make it a part of our Lenten practice to open our ears to hear them and open our hearts to love and justice.
