Ash Wednesday also begins the Lenten journey of spiritual re-emergence. During this ancient ceremony which began in the 7th century, ashes were places on the foreheads of the faithful as a sign of personal penitence. This began a time of waiting and preparation for the journey ahead. We have carried this observance into the 21st century and we too prepare for the days ahead with hope, determination and faithfulness.

No doubt the weather has been cold and relentless and it is easy to settle in and just wait for spring to bring warmer days and lighter moments. But, we might as well put this time to good use while we wait for that gust of rebirth to come and amaze us. God wants to hear from us, because he made us, because he saves us, because he loves us.


