1 John 3: 16-24

NEW TESTAMENT READING

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers and sisters. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

Little children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. GOSPEL READING John 10: 11-18

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own, and my own know me, just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father. LIVE IT

For families to do together

Parenting is shepherd-like — loving, guiding, protecting. Spend some time reviewing your family's safety plans. How can your child call you for help? (Review home/cell/work numbers.) Who should they call if you can't be reached? Remind them of all the "shepherds" in their life who can help them find their way.

For younger kids

Help someone look for something this week— be sleuth-like shepherds and look for something that is lost or misplaced.

For older kids

Use the internet to search on the word "shepherd." How many websites talk about shepherding sheep and how many talk about church programs? Try "good shepherd" and see what comes up.
